



Hope you have a lot of fun doing these beautiful Picwraps in form of a ball. (Picdots) I created these for my sons first communion and they were a hit on many levels, I never gotten so many compliments for a decoration from men, Wow they were really impressed and they were the first ones that wanted to pull down their Picdot to take home. We had so much fun making them, I send all the materials ahead, since we flew in for our event, a couple of days before our event we got together and had a blast making them. We also had a table full of Picwraps with all of our family members, past and present, not one of these keepsakes were left behind.

So Ladies, here is the receipt. It is simple, we had a lot of false starts, and our first picdot had the images in a square form and they were 1 1/2in x 1 1/2. It took us 2 hours to make that ball. Too much time so back to the drawing board. So I made them bigger but they looked were ugly big, so I cut them in a circle with a great little tool

I got from the Martha Steward line in Michaels. And well it was love at first sight.

So here are your tools and materials you will need

Martha Steward Circle cutter

Paper Lantern size 10 or 12

30 to 60 pound Paper white

Two sided 3m tape

Color Printer



Depending on the size of your circles print your pictures. We use 4 inch circles for our Picdots. We used 36 pictures for an 8 inch ball, 48 pictures for a 10 inch ball and 56 for the 12 inch ball. We printed on both side, these balls can we used as flowers as well and looked beautiful. On any side of the circle put the double sided tape on all cut circles. Do not remove the back side yet. Do not take short cuts, we tried them all. Silicon, taping the lanterns, stick glue they do not work properly, the silicon does not give it that

natural look, taping the lantern will not give the proper hold to your circles, and the stick glue will not hold in hot weather. If you do find another short cut, that works love to hear about it.



This is my second attempt after the first one that is also beautiful but too much work, but you can decide for yourself, the bottom one took 3 12 x 18 sheets and I cut them with a paper cutter.



1-Start from the bottom up. Do not start from the top, unless you want to find your circles on the floor the next morning. The bottom takes 5 to 6 circles depending on the size you are creating.



After the first row continue, count from the last picture row 3 up and continue until our picdot is done.

It takes 20 min to complete each one and after a while 10 min. Practice makes perfect.



We printed on both sides, it's up to you if you are hanging up high it might look awkward if you only have one side and the other white.

Kit G 56 cut circle printed on one side

Kit H 56 cut circles printed on both sides
